

The *Interdisciplinary Scholar Awards* supports individual Ordinary PC faculty members in any department or program in the School of Arts & Sciences who bring an interdisciplinary approach to their own research. Two awards of \$2,000 each are anticipated.

Awards can be used for research expenses (research or conference travel, supplies, fees, etc.), stipends for student researchers, and/or faculty stipends up to \$500 per faculty member. Projects can be based on existing or continuing research initiatives or may represent a new direction of study. The incorporation of student researchers is encouraged, but not required.

Applications will be reviewed by an ad-hoc committee of Arts & Sciences faculty members with representatives from multiple disciplines, including interdisciplinary programs. The grant period will run from July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2022.

Recipients of the interdisciplinary awards will be required to submit a brief (2-4 pages) report by September 15, 2022 describing their work and accomplishments during the award period. They will also present their work to a peer audience in an informal venue after the conclusion of the award period.
